- Meeting called to order 6:34pm
- Reviewed August minutes and made changes. Will forward to absent Board members to ratify
- 1. Superintendent's Report
 - Staff vacations
 - Staff vacation period ends 9/30 per union agreement
 - Mr. River will take vacation outside this period due to role in ongoing window replacement project
 - Window Replacement
 - 8 apartments complete in 35th Ave as of 9/10/2024
 - All windows expected to fit on floors 1-5 6th floor windows are different size
 - 1 window in 1 apartment, 1 whole unit left in 78th St as of 9/10/2024
 - Handful of apartments left in 77th due to window size as of 9/10/2024
 - Delays due to mismeasured windows mistake on Tindel's part for not measuring every apartment(6th floors are different size)
 - Mr. Sorotkin has admitted to this and will endure cost

- Plaster repairs
 - Starting 4th floor on 78th st
- Waterproofing 78th st and bulkhead work
 - Proposal sent, significant cost discrepancy with identical text to previous proposal
 - Mr. Doran will consult with Mr. Lister and have him contact
 Tindel to clarify
 - Motion to accept proposal contingent on explanation for price difference
- B-Side 35th Ave exit Carlos will break concrete ramp and install steel ramp
 - Ramp will be closed while contractor takes measurements to fabricate 4 to 5 days likely
- Compactor chute cleaning by Power Green
 - \$2935.62 for all 6 chutes
- Renovations underway on 2 Co-Op Owned Apartments
 - B34 35th will be complete next Wednesday 9/18/2024
- Weds Oct 23rd photos will be taken of staff for Berkeley website
- Discussion of issues with noise in garden
 - Board working out an equitable solution for all shareholders
 - Note: Ending of guiet hours coincides with arrival of landscapers
- Affidavits for uninterruptible gas signed buildings go on oil if temperature drops under 20 F
- Mr. Rivera left the meeting at 7:33pm

 - Co-op tax credits and related assessments issued for Sept billing
 - Request for float operating to cover negative cash on hand will be repaid by end of year
- Co-op owned apartments
- Local Law 88
 - Proposal requested from Code Green Solutions
- Wavecrest Termination
 - Wavecrest did not close books following Q1 termination.

BUILDING ENERGY EFFICIENCY UPDATE

In case you missed it!

The energy efficiency ratings of all three buildings have improved. The 78th Street building has an A rating and score of 96. The 77th Street building has an A rating and score of 94 and the 35th Ave building has a B rating and score of 83. This is great news for our coop as we continue to work to meet the requirements of Local Law 97 and live in a sustainable city. Currently, none of our buildings would be subject to fines under Local Law 97 until 2030 at the earliest.

Tindel has installed windows in over 85% of apartments at The Berkeley as of Monday, October 7th. Tindel has finally received missing sixth floor windows for 77th Street, and they are installed the windows on the sixth floor at 77th Street during the week of October 7-11. Tindel will be about 98% complete by Friday, October 18th. They will be returning to the Berkeley after October 18th to install windows in a few apartments that could not be scheduled earlier.

Take this opportunity to open a close the top and bottom of EVERY new window and screen. If you have any issues with your new windows that Tindel and/or the architect needs to address, email Carlos at: superberkeley@gmail.com Please don't call him, unless it's an emergency, as he is working non-stop in apartments.

Of course, the windows have a warranty, but it will be a much faster response time if we correct problems while Tindel is on premises.

We know how slow the plaster repair is going. Carlos, Joe Doren and Walter are looking for another worker. Carlos has a lead, fingers crossed. On top of that, we are out our handyman John due to health issues. We promise to keep you all updated with the issue.
